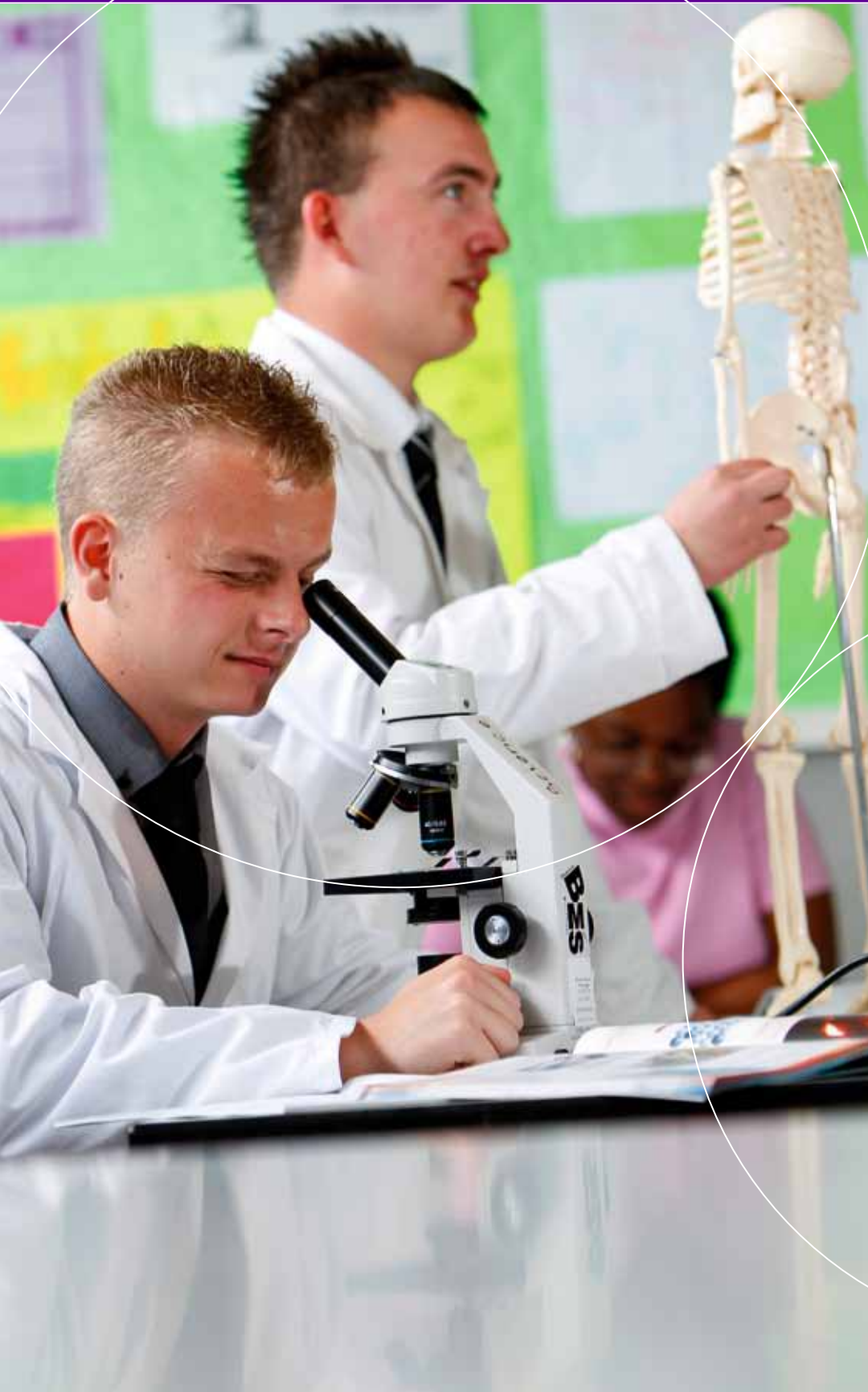

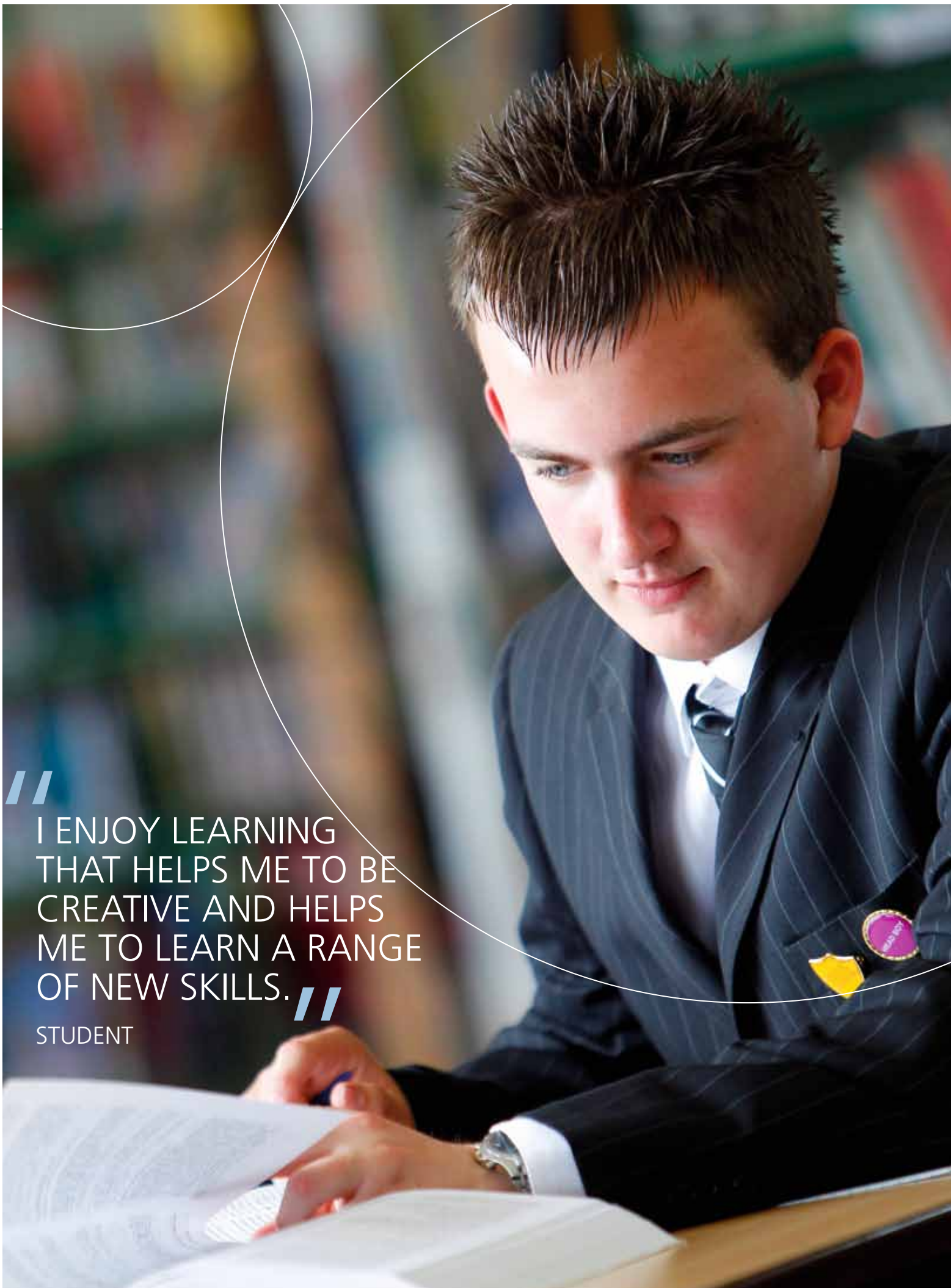

Post 16 Welcome

We have a broad and motivating range of courses for Post 16 students. In addition to a range of A/AS levels, we also offer a range of vocational courses (Details of specific courses on offer are shown on the enclosed leaflets).

Harris Falconwood Post 16 strives to:

- Encourage high academic standards and to enable each student to achieve his/her full potential.
- Encourage and maintain personal high standards in work, conduct and presentation and to foster an acceptance of individual responsibility in this respect.
- Place every student on a programme of study appropriate to his/her ability and needs.
- Allow every student individual freedom wherever possible, in order to prepare him/her for planning his/her time at University or for entry into employment.
- Provide all necessary guidance with regard to entry to Universities, Colleges of Higher Education or employment.
- Encourage every student to take a full and active part in the life of Post 16 and to contribute to its leadership.

We believe that Post 16 courses should be a preparation for each student's higher education course or career. As part of the Post 16 interview, students are asked about their future plans to ensure that the course they are starting will fit with these aspirations.

During the course of study, our careers consultant will advise students about applying for higher education, application forms, entry qualifications and career prospects. Students also get the opportunity to attend Careers Fairs and University conferences.



Pastoral

We believe that success comes from a partnership between teachers and students. All staff are highly qualified and experienced to teach Post 16 courses.

Every Post 16 student has a form tutor. In the tutorial periods students cover topics which are relevant to life within the Academy and beyond. Students have the opportunity to discuss University, work and social aspects of their life after Post 16 through a structured tutorial programme. All Post 16 students will work towards a Level 3 Work Skills qualification providing them with valuable UCAS points and employability preparation.

We provide an environment that supports high quality learning, through rigorous study support and a varied tutoring system.

Each student is monitored – half-termly progress is shared with students and their families and appropriate targets are set. All students have access to a team of staff offering support which is targeted at their identified needs.

Our new multi-million pound building provides exceptional new facilities, across each and every subject area.

The fully equipped fitness suite, dance studio and sports hall, complete with a rock climbing wall provides excellent opportunities for indoor activities. Excellent outdoor facilities include a full size 3G AstroTurf pitch, with a competition standard running track. We also run sports courses in conjunction with local sports providers and organisations.

We are richly equipped with the latest ICT facilities, including interactive whiteboards and high-speed internet-linked computers. Students have access to a laptop or computer during the Academy day to support their independent learning.

Our Post 16 students have a dedicated study area.

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

Beyond the classroom, we provide students with diverse enrichment courses and opportunities.

Our Post 16 enrichment programme offers students a chance to develop a wide range of skills and talents. These skills can be linked to subjects or courses studied, or they may be an area of study students are taking part in for the first time. The aim of enrichment is to help foster or develop skills and talents that students have a passion or interest in, that directly relate to skills required in real world situations.

Students are also offered the opportunity to take part in a range of offsite activities such as visiting art galleries, taking part in sport at a local facility or watching a theatre performance. Students will also have the opportunity to develop valuable life skills including cooking and financial awareness.

Our main focus at Post 16 is to inspire and prepare students for life after the Academy, whatever their aspirations may be. We aim to develop their decision-making and problem-solving skills as well as their independence.

We have links with business and industry and use these to give students the opportunity to take part in meaningful work experience in an area related to their ultimate career interests.

Careers support

A full programme of careers and educational guidance is available. Our Connexions adviser runs career sessions, focusing on planning for the future and supporting students in making decisions. We help students with University and job applications and the preparation of quality CVs.

We are currently working with a number of Universities to support our students in their progression to higher education.

We encourage our Post 16 students to take on responsibilities both in and outside of the Academy. These help develop skills not just for work or University but also for life. They build self-esteem. We want our students to believe in themselves and believe they can be successful in their adult life.

Post 16 students work with students from other Harris Academies and attend Federation events including Careers and Enterprise days and other relevant activities.

GCSE Mathematics and English Language

Those students who have not passed their GCSE English or Mathematics to at least a Grade C standard, are given tuition and the opportunity to retake the exam.

Work based placement and employer engagement

All students are required to undertake a work based placement throughout their course. Employers work with the subject leaders to ensure a quality provision. Students benefit from employer mentoring and valuable work experience.

Induction Day in Summer Term

An induction day is made available for students to sample activities from the courses we offer. This is a great opportunity to experience life at Falconwood, meet staff and make friends. It is expected that all students who have accepted places should attend this event.

RECOGNISING YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS

We place great emphasis on recognising and reporting progress and success in everything that our students do.

Thanks to our tracking systems, students always know where they are and what they have to do in order to progress to the next stage.

Harris Academy Falconwood is committed to student success and when a student succeeds, we like to celebrate. We recognise these successes at special Celebration of Achievement Evenings, where students' effort and work is formally and publicly recognised and special prizes are given to mark outstanding achievement.

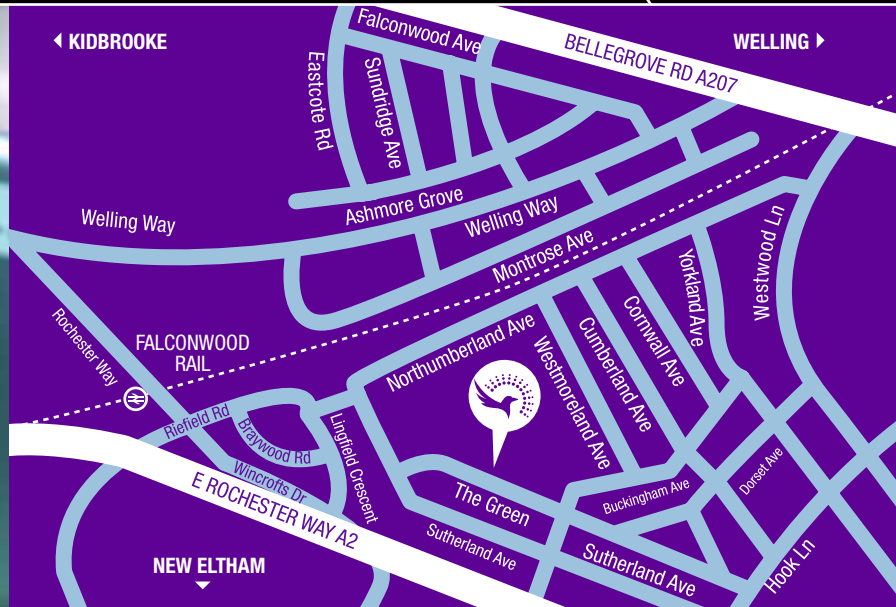
